Extending our reach

Since 2017, thousands of children and families have come to FamilyForward seeking help, healing, and hope. But we know there is still an overwhelming need for our services. To help address that need, we purchased 9.5 acres of property in September 2021 to allow us to grow and serve more children and families. The expansive facility will enable us to serve twice as many children and families with complex trauma by 2025. We are walking alongside children and families on their thousand-mile journey to hope and healing... and we are one step closer. Thank you to all those that have supported along the way.

Better together

Maria, a single mother to two young children, came to FamilyForward when she found her child, Sam, was struggling in school.

Sam was unable to focus, was acting out, and falling behind in his courses. Maria knew she needed support in advocating for her child, so she turned to FamilyForward's Developmental Trauma Center.

Our clinicians welcomed Sam and began assessments utilizing a comprehensive and individualized approach to understand the root of what was causing him to struggle in school.

We worked directly with Sam's teachers, utilizing the assessments and recommendations to create an environment that worked with his needs. Our assessment team wrote Sam a story to help him understand why he was struggling in school. We walked alongside Maria and attended Sam's Individualized Education Program (IEP) meetings, and worked collaboratively with his teachers to develop a plan to help him receive the specialized instruction and services he needs to be successful.

Our assessments generate a visual representation of the developmental strengths and vulnerabilities of a child. This allows our caring and dedicated staff to support children and provide caregivers with the tools needed to help give kids like Sam the future they deserve.

Incorporating the Neurosequential Model, developed by Bruce D. Perry, MD, PhD, our clinical team supports children and families on their path to healing by providing assessment, treatment, and parent education services. Our Therapeutic Preschool serves children three to five, offering individual assessments and therapy designed to address emotional behavior and relational difficulties caused by early trauma.

976 Community Services

We serve clients in the home, community, or office, providing mentoring, parent coaching and education, and therapy services for young and pregnant parents and families with children up to the age of 19. Our prevention and early intervention services promote resiliency in each family to cushion and avoid potential adverse impacts of early childhood trauma.

As a Children's Permanency Partnership member, FamilyForward provides foster care and adoption case management, recruitment, training, and licensing services for foster and adoptive families.


376 Redevelopment Opportunities for Women (ROW)

After much thought and consideration, FamilyForward ceased operations of our Redevelopment Opportunities for Women services in September 2022. The discontinuation of services allows us to focus on our commitment to preventing and treating child abuse and severe neglect.




